### Cultural Internship Scholarship

This program is designed for exchange students from our partner universities in the U.S. and select European countries, where we prioritize maintaining exchange balance. The program offers a comprehensive scholarship to assist students with travel and living expenses while they immerse themselves in Korean culture.

### **Scholarship Benefits:**

- Dormitory Fee Waiver: Students will have their Global Village dormitory fees (872,000 KRW) fully waived for the duration of their stay.
- Airfare Reimbursement: Students are eligible to receive up to 800,000 KRW in airfare reimbursement.
- Weekly Stipend: Students will receive a weekly stipend of 120,000 KRW for 10 weeks, totaling 1,200,000 KRW, to assist with living expenses.

#### **Program Features:**

- Language Exchange: Students will participate in 1:1 English language exchanges with Korean students for 8 to 12 hours per week, enhancing their cross-cultural living experience.
- Cultural Events: Participation in our curated cultural events is mandatory. These events provide students with opportunities to deeply engage with Korean traditions, history, and culture, enriching their overall exchange experience.



- Roommate Experience: Students will have the unique opportunity to live with a Korean roommate, further enhancing the cultural exchange experience in the Global Village dormitory.
This program offers a focused, language-driven cultural experience, allowing students to engage with Korean peers while enjoying the benefits of the Global Village community.
